PLAYERS TO WATCH:

Joey Spallina, A, Mount Sinai (N.Y.) / Syracuse

There isn't a player in the class who's been more battle-tested and proven over a long period of time quite like Spallina, who played up two grades with the Team 91 Crush 2020 team. Possessing a tremendous skillset and a fine-tuned bag of tricks, coaches rave about his advanced lacrosse IQ and physicality, as he's crazy effective when posting up his man. Spallina racked up an incredible 131 points as a freshman All-American in 2019. He took on all comers as a constant presence on the summer circuit, getting a strong push from Dom Pietramala for the top spot

Dominic Pietramala, A, Boys' Latin (Md.) / North Carolina

A left-handed gunslinging attackman by trade, Pietramala is tremendously slick, highly athletic and able to put pressure on opposing defenses, elevating his game as a dynamic midfielder after joining the Hawks this summer. His game's that much more intriguing because he doesn't need the ball (**CONTINUED**):

as much to be successful, a byproduct of his sky-high lacrosse IQ — no surprise given that he’s one of all-time great Dave Pietramala’s twin sons. Tallying 33 goals and 10 assists as a freshman for the Lakers, Dominic was among the MIAA’s most dominant players.

Joey Terenzi, M, Manhasset (N.Y.) / Virginia

Terenzi’s skillset and body of work were hard to ignore. He was remarkable as a freshman for the Indians, scoring the double-overtime game-winner against archrival Garden City in the 2019 Nassau County championship, which speaks volumes about Terenzi’s confidence and ability. Among a plethora of heralded ’22 middies to miss the entire summer, when healthy, Terenzi is tough, aggressive and creative with his dodging style, earning him clear No. 1 status at his position.

Thomas Ricciardelli, G, New Canaan (Conn.) / Notre Dame

The younger of the two brothers, Thomas, will also be heading to Notre Dame this fall to rejoin his brother, Jeffery. The Fairfield County native protects the cage by any means necessary. Making a ton of extra saves with his body. Keeps his cool after surrendering a goal, and really thrives outside of the crease. Routinely clears the ball right into his teammates sticks in stride. Look for Ricciardelli to shut down the South squad.

Mac Eldridge, FO, Georgetown Prep (Md.) / Virginia

There’s no doubt Eldridge, 6’1”, 190 pounds, is benefitting from a Pat Spencer-esque growth spurt, making him a downright scary matchup for opposing face-off men. Athletic and blessed with ourageous hand speed, he hasn’t shown many weaknesses. It’s clear he’s dialed in the standing neutral grip and serves as the major catalyst for DC Express and Georgetown Prep. The Richmond native will return home to join Lars Tiffany’s program next season.

FAMILY TIES: The North’s **Griffin Scane**, Clarkston, Mich., and Thomas Ricciardelli, New Canaan, Conn., both are the second family member to selected as Senior Game All-Americans. Griffin’s sister, Izzy, was a 2021 Tewaaraton Finalist and Big Ten Attacker of the Year. Thomas’s brother, Jeffery, was a 2021 Senior Game All-American and notched five goals for Notre Dame in his first year with the Fighting Irish.

9 OF 12: Maryland’s Logan Wisnauskas became the ninth All-America alum in the past twelve years to win the prestigious **Tewaaraton Award**. Of this year’s Tewaaraton finalists, three are former Senior Game All-Americans.

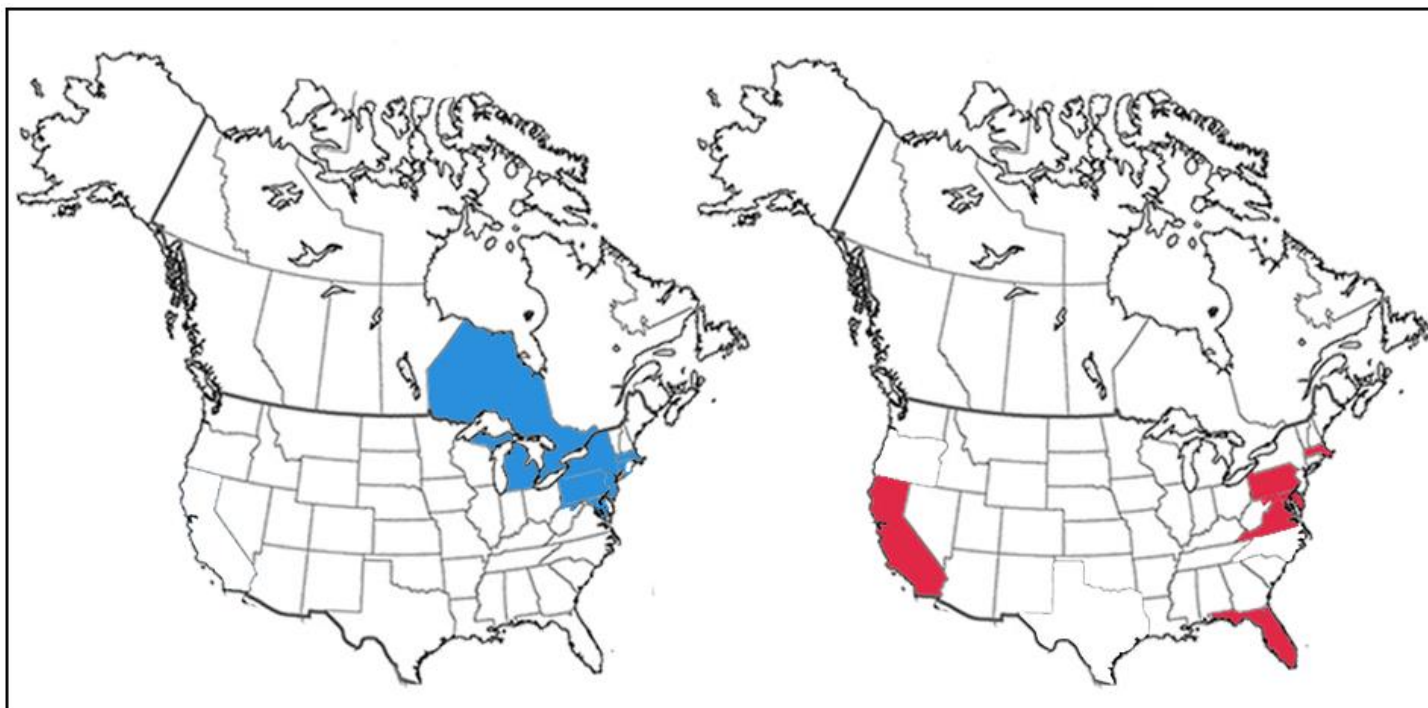
